English

Throughout our English lessons this half term, we will build on our skills from Reception to:

- ⇒ Apply phonics when sounding out and count sounds in words.
- \Rightarrow Discuss our predictions about stories.
- ⇒ Retell familiar stories.
- ⇒ Use our imagination to innovate stories.


Maths

We will begin by consolidating key skills learnt throughout the Early Years and develop our mathematical thinking to:

- Sort objects in different ways.
- Count forwards and backwards within 10.
- Find one more and one less than for numbers to 10.
- Compare numbers and objects using greater than, less than and equal to.

Reading at home

- Your child will read their reading book three times in school during the week as part of our Phonics scheme, Little Wandle and then bring it home to read to you each Friday
- Every child will be able to choose a book from the library to take home every week and share with you.

- Get your baby photos ready to discuss changes within ourselves.


RE

As scientists we will:



Identify a variety of wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

Dissect plants to help us identify and describe the basic structure.
