




# Typical Timetable

- Every day, children will have a Phonics, English and Maths lesson.
- To revisit maths learning and embed understanding, children will also have Recall lessons.

#### Each week:

- Children will have 3 Reading sessions- we follow the Little Wandle Scheme.
  - Children will have 2 PE lessons.
  - They will have one Science lesson.
- Depending on the half termly topic, they will have either History/ Geography lessons.
- Each half term, it will alternate, and they will have either Art/ Design and Technology lessons.
  - Each half term, they will have either Computing/ Music lessons.
    - They will have a PSHE and RE lesson once a week too.

#### Start and End of Day Procedure

8:40am - Doors open and children are greeted by the teacher at the Year I doors.

Classrooms are located on the Key Stage one playground. Yew class on the left and Beech on the right.

3:20pm- Parents should form a single line for each class. Children will be called in line order.



# During their time in Year I, what will children experience?

- To begin with, there will be a phased transition from Reception. This will include continuous/ enhanced provision.
- Opportunity to go on educational visits.
- Opportunity to learn to play an ocarina in music lessons.
- Opportunity to meet visitors in school.



## Preparing for Year I Can your child.....

- Dress themselves independently?
- Independently zip up their coat?
- Put shoes on correct feet (left and right) and can they tie their own shoe laces (if wearing shoes with laces)?
- Use a knife and fork correctly?
- Find the next available page in a book?
- Use a glue stick correctly and stick in neatly?
- Hold a pencil with tripod grip?
- Draw straight lines with a ruler?
- Write letters on a line?



#### Assessment

- -Alongside ongoing assessment, the children will complete formal assessments at the end of each term; in line with the whole school approach.
- -There is a National Phonics Screening Check in June, where children will be tested on their ability to read and decode sounds in words (more information will be shared closer to the time).



Reading

-At the beginning of Year I, children will be assessed to see if there are any gaps from Reception phonics that need to be addressed.

- -Children will be allocated a reading level based on these assessments.
- -Books will be read in school and sent home every week.
- -Please read with your child at home, take care of the book and remember to bring it back, so it can be changed weekly.
- -Children will also get chance to visit the school library.



### During the first half term, we will check to see if....

- -Children can independently write their first and last name.
- Count forwards and backwards and recognise numbers to 20.
- Write numbers to 10.
- Form letters correctly.

### Uniform

For autumn term, children should be in shirt and tie.

Our PE kit is changing. The children should wear a green polo top for PE regardless on which colour team they are in. They should wear black joggers/ leggers and suitable trainers. They can also wear a plain black jumper on colder days.

#### Reminders

- -Please ensure your child has a set of spare clothes in their bag e.g. pants, socks, top, shorts.
- -Children should bring a 500ml water bottle which will fit in the school carriers (Westfield bottles are available to purchase). -Children should bring a clearly labelled basic pencil case. They will need: 2x pencils, a rubber, ruler, sharpener, glue, coloured pencils/crayons (to stay at school).
