Every Week

Children will bring home an accelerated reading book at their reading level. They are able to quiz in school and change their book as soon as they have quizzed. Please read for a minimum of 20 minutes each day.

Every Friday, children will be set a homework task for maths or English—this should be returned to school by the following Wednesday and should take around 30 minutes per week.

Children will be given a login to TTRS (Times Tables Rock Stars) In Year 6 children are expected to know up to 12x tables. We ask that children complete 20 minutes of games across the week.

Maya Glyph Artwork

Research Maya glyphs and create your name using Maya-inspired symbols.

Present it as a decorative piece of artwork.

Newspaper Report

Report on the discovery of a hidden Maya temple.



Local Community Challenge

Research a local issue, charity or community project and present your findings.

You could include:

Why it matters

Who it helps

How people can get involved

Biography Writing

Produce a biography about a famous or inspiring scientist of your choice!



Build a Maya Temple

Construct a model Maya pyramid. You could use any materials you have available (cardboard, LEGO, Recycled materials, Wooden craft sticks)

Include labels explaining key features.

Maya Number System

Research the Maya number system and write numbers using dots and bars.

Can you: Write your age? Write numbers to 100? Create calculations?

Maya Coding Challenge

Use Scratch (or another software) to create an animated Maya temple scene or a simple educational game with an Maya theme.

Inventor Challenge

Invent a product that solves an everyday problem. Draw and label your design and explain the science behind how it works.
