Timetable

Each day:

 Children will have a comprehension/spelling, English, Maths and Recall lesson.

Each week:

- Children will have 2 PE lessons (on alternate Tuesdays, swimming).
- They will have one Science lesson.
- Children will have 5 Recall Lesson to revisit and embed previously taught mathematical concepts.
- They will have a PSHE and RE lesson once a week too.

Alternating lessons each half term:

- Either History/ Geography lessons.
- Either Art/ Design and Technology lessons.
- Either Computing/ Music lessons.



Arrival and Dismissal

- In the morning, children enter from the KS2 playground into the building as they have previously.
- This year, Children will have lockers, so will put their, bag lunchbox and coat into them before going to class. Water bottles and pencil cases will be brought up to class with them.
- At the end of the day, children will be released from the KS2 building to the KS2 playground. Anyone collecting should stand on the playground and be clearly visible.
- Children will be dismissed in the order in which they are standing. They will let the teacher know if they see anyone, if not they will be asked to stand next to their teacher until an adult arrives.
- Water bottles all children can bring a water bottle into class. It must be a 500ml bottle - no bigger!

Swimming

Year 5 will attend swimming lessons on alternate
Tuesdays, with the aim to swim 25 meters unaided. They
will also develop water safety skills as part of the
programme.

When swimming, children will need to bring:

- Full swimming costume / trunks
- Goggles (if needed)
- Swimming cap (if needed)
- Towel
- During colder months, it is important children bring a coat for walking to and from the leisure centre.

Pencil Cases

In September, children can bring their own pencil case and equipment to school. However, they are responsible for the contents of their pencil case – do not send them with valuable pieces of stationery.

They should ONLY bring:

- a plain pencil case (no novelty cases)
- a pencil
- a blue ballpoint or rollerball pen
- a ruler
- a pencil sharpener
- glue stick
- a rubber
- pencil crayons


Please no novelty stationery – it will be removed and kept on the teacher's desk until the end of the day.



Uniform

Accelerated Reading

- Each term, children will complete a star reading assessment to determine their book reading level.
- They are expected to complete a quiz once they have read their book.
- In Year 5, children are reading larger, more complex texts, so therefore we understand that quizzes are less frequent.
- Children are expected to read everyday and record their progress in their reading log books.

Library Books
